#### FROM SANGHYEON'S DESK

The Heart of Coffee, the Heart of Faith...

These days, many people enjoy drinking coffee. If you look at the cafe menu, there are so many types of coffee. Among them, there is one that is hard to reach for because it is small in quantity, strong, and



bitter. That is espresso. Espresso may be difficult to drink on its own, but it is the basis of all coffee.

If you add water to espresso, it becomes a short black or long black, and if you pour warm milk, it becomes a cafe latte. If you add milk foam and top it with cinnamon powder or chocolate powder, it becomes a cappuccino, and if you add caramel syrup, it becomes a caramel macchiato. If you add chocolate syrup, it becomes a cafe mocha. The starting point of such a variety of coffee menus is espresso. That is why espresso is called the 'heart of coffee.'

There are basic in our lives, but they are so small that they are not noticeable, monotonous, and even so difficult that we hesitate to do them, but without those basics, we cannot achieve anything. If you are faithful to the basics, you can build anything on top of them. Just as espresso is the starting point for various coffees, our basics will also be the starting point for creating a richer life. Believe in the small but

strong power of basics. There may be sweet, creative, and amazing possibilities hidden within them.

The heart of the Christian faith lies in the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The place where God's love was revealed through His Son Jesus Christ is the cross and his resurrection. The basics and beginning of the Christian faith begin with the cross and resurrection. May this Easter season be a time when we can recover, experience, and share God's love and grace.


