# FROM SANGHYEON'S DESK

### The Eternal Victory of the Lord

Marx was originally an economist and philosopher of history. However, he called himself a revolutionary. There are various interpretations of his role, but the world had to experience a much more intense history of conflict and bloodshed with the communist revolutionary theory he advocated. His dichotomous view of humanity soon formed a 'structure of opposition of hatred' between the haves and the have-nots, the capitalists and the workers, the haves and the have-nots. Under the pretext of fair distribution, he established a dictatorship more cruel than that of the capitalists by enthroning a small class of workers, and controlled the people with chains and prisons that exploited human rights. However, the communist empire he built with his ideas failed utterly.

Even Napoleon, the hero who ruled Europe, was eventually exiled to St. Helena and left these words: "Alexander, Caesar, Charlemagne, and I built empires with force... But Jesus Christ built his empire with love... What a vast chasm exists between my misery and the eternal kingdom of Christ! Who is he whom people still love, worship, and he rules the world? ... He is God!"

The way Jesus changes the world was unprecedented, beyond human imagination. That is why even his closest disciples betrayed him. But in the end, everyone knows Jesus is the only true way and the truth.

Before Easter on April 20, we begin Lent on March 5. God gives us time and opportunity to experience his love, suffering, sacrifice, death, resurrection and life, as we confess that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life for all. During Lent, I hope we will become close to God's Word and experience the eternal victory of Jesus Christ through his death on the cross and his resurrection through time of prayer and meditation.
