FROM SANGHYEON'S DESK

"A Small Kindness, a Great Miracle"

In Kansas City, USA, there lived a man known as the 'Secret Santa,' Larry Stewart (1948-2007). Once a successful businessman, a devastating failure left him homeless overnight. One cold winter day, unable to bear the hunger, he entered a restaurant and ordered food without a penny to his name. When he pretended to have lost his wallet, the chef quietly handed him \$20 and said, "Sir, I think you dropped this on the floor."

That single act of warm kindness transformed his life. The following year, Larry gave a \$20 tip to a waitress working in the cold without a coat. She broke down in tears, saying, "Sir, you have no idea what this money means to me." From that day forward, Christmas for him was no longer a day for 'receiving' but a day for 'giving.' Over 26 years, the total amount he gave away reached approximately \$1.5 million. Even in his final year in 2007, while battling oesophageal cancer, he went out onto the streets as usual to dispense money to those in need. After his passing, the 'Kansas City's Secret Santa' was created

to carry on his legacy, and countless 'Secret Santas' across the US continue to spread the warmth he left behind.

It seems the hardest good deed to perform is the one done where no one knows, and no one is watching. This is not to say that performing a good deed publicly diminishes its meaning. Rather, the problem lies in *ignoring* opportunities to help simply because they are unseen. If more people would commit acts of kindness in places unseen, wouldn't the world be a much brighter place? In these challenging times, we hope to see more people embrace that spirit.

"But when you give to someone in need, don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing. Give your gifts in private, and your Father, who sees everything, will reward you." (Matthew 6:3-4, NLT)
