FROM SANGHYEON'S DESK

"Who will you pick up?"

In a job interview for a new employee at a certain company, an interviewer asked a question that made the applicants feel embarrassed: "On a stormy night, you are driving and you see a bus stop in front of you. There are three people standing at the bus stop: a grandmother who needs to be taken to the hospital right away, a doctor who saved your life from a terminal illness, and the woman of your dreams. If you could only pick up one of them, who would you pick up?"

However, despite having many shortcomings compared to other applicants, an unexpectedly successful candidate passed the interview with confidence. The answer given by this candidate was: "I will give the car to the doctor who saved my life and ask him to take my grandmother to the hospital. Then, I will wait for the bus at the bus stop with the woman of my dreams." While other applicants insisted on driving to avoid the wind and rain, he gave up on the car.

Life is a fierce battle between 'hoping' and 'abandoning' something. If you hold and carry too many things, your hands and arms will hurt. If you carry and carry too many things, your neck and shoulders will hurt. If you look at too many things, your eyes will hurt. If you think about

too many things, your head will hurt. And if you hold too many things, your heart will hurt.

The reason we have so many pains is that we want and have too many things. So the happiest resolution in my life might be to 'give up' for someone. What will you give up for others today?

"If you try to hang on to your life, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for my sake, you will save it. And what do you benefit if you gain the whole world but lose your own soul? Is anything worth more than your soul?" (Matthew 16:25-26)
